Boston Common Golf's inaugural season begins Monday, Jan. 27 in prime time on ESPN and ESPN+ in the U.S., U-NEXT in Japan, and other prominent media partners around the globe. The first-ever league match will be taking place in just under a month, on Tuesday, Jan. 7.



Famous in Japan


Studying individuals from around the world who are famous in Japan, both past and present.

Praise Shadows is deeply honored to share the newest body of work by Yuri Shimojo in the upcoming exhibition, <u>Mirrors</u>, her second solo at the gallery. This collection of ink paintings were made in the aftermath of her cancer treatment and diagnosis, the passing of her beloved dog and companion Rudy, and a long-delayed visit to Japan to parse through the archives of her deceased family and her samurai ancestors. Shimojo's fluid, intuitive painting style is an expression of these recent years of upheaval, loss, and healing. In the simplest sense, Shimojo paints to tell us that she is grateful to be alive.



GLOBAL STUDIES PROGRAM SUMMER 2025

GPI US Global Studies Program - Fully Funded Volunteer Opportunity

This upcoming summer 2025, GPI US will be hosting their Global Studies Program in Japan where university students will get the opportunity to become discussion leaders for Japanese high school students.

The Global Studies Program is a 3-week, fully-funded (flight included) volunteer opportunity for students and recent graduates to immerse themselves in Japanese culture while assisting Japanese high school students to develop critical thinking and global leadership skills. In addition, participants will be required to lead discussions on topics that vary from global issues and leadership. All of this will be conducted in English, no Japanese is required. This is a great opportunity for participants to enhance leadership skills and provide educational opportunities for others.

The early application deadline is December 30, 2024, and the regular deadline is January 31, 2025.

Arts of Japan Starting May 11, 2024 <u>Museum of Fine Arts Boston</u>

The MFA has one of the most comprehensive collections of Japanese art anywhere in the world. Reimagined galleries explore Japan's art and visual culture from the 7th century to today, including painting, sculpture, decorative arts, and selections from the Museum's vast collection of ukiyo-e prints. Evocative spaces include the renovated Japanese Buddhist Temple Room, which opened in 1909, and an adaptation of a traditional tea room, with tatami mats and an alcove. Multimedia displays illuminate performative art forms, such as Nō theater, bringing their drama to life.

The new space for the Museum's unparalleled Japanese collection—which was the first of its kind in America when established in 1890, and now holds about 100,000 objects—will change regularly, giving visitors the opportunity to see even more works in a setting that honors and celebrates Japan's rich history and cultural legacy.
