四字熟語 - よじじゅくご (4 Character Idiom)

ばんこくきょうつう 万国 共通

Things that are the same no matter what country you go to; common to the whole world; universal

Example

<u>美味しい食べ物は**万国共通**だ。</u>

Oishii tabemono wa **bankokukyoutsuu** da.

Delicious food is universal.

ことわざ (Proverb)

When the unreasonable prevails, reason retreats

Example

<u>たった一分遅れただけと言って、締め切りに遅れても</u> <u>点数を引かなければ、「無理が通れば道理引っ込む」</u> <u>で、学生は締め切り守らなくなってくるから、</u> <u>やめたほうがいいだろう。</u>

Tatta ichifun okureta dake to itte, shimekiri ni okurete mo tensuu wo hikanakereba, "**muri ga tooreba douri hikkomu**" de, gakusei wa shimekiri mamoranakunattekuru kara, yameta hou ga ii darou.

If you don't deduct points for missing the deadline even by one minute, students will stop observing the deadline in a case of "when the unreasonable prevails, reason retreats," so it's best not to go down that path.





Fast facts!

-Fukuoka prefecture is the northernmost prefecture on the island of Kyushu in southwestern Japan

-The capital city Fukuoka is the result of the fusion of two cities in 1889, when the port city of Hakata and the former castle town of Fukuoka were merged into one

-The name Hakata is still used for many things, including ramen, clay dolls, the main railway station, and a major ward downtown -Seaside Momochi is Fukuoka's waterfront located on reclaimed land along Hakata Bay. The area was originally developed to serve as the site of the 1989 Asia Pacific Expo. Fukuoka Tower, beaches, museums, and the Fukuoka Paypay Dome can all be found here -For more info about Fukuoka, check out our March 2023 issue!





<u>南蔵院 (なんぞいん) - Nanzo-in Temple</u>

Nanzo-in Temple is a Shingon Buddhist temple in Sasaguri, Fukuoka. Of the 88 temples that make up the Sasaguri pilgrimage route, it is considered the head temple. It is most famous for its huge bronze statue of a reclining Buddha: 41 m/135 ft long, 11 m/36 ft high, and nearly 300 tons. Buddha is shown at the moment of death, or entrance into nirvana.
