岡山県(おかやまけん) - Okayama Prefecture

Fast facts!

- Okayama Prefecture is located in the southwest of the island of Honshu. It borders the Seto Inland Sea and includes many islands
- With a warm and dry climate, the prefecture is known as "the Land of Sunshine" because it has the highest number of sunny days in Japan
- The capital city Okayama is famous for its vibrancy, white peaches, and muscat grapes and serves as a major transportation hub
- The famous folktale Momotaro is often associated with Okayama, with many considering the region to be the hero's birthplace. A statue of Momotaro with his dog, monkey, and pheasant companions is located in front of Okayama Station
- The town of Bizen in the northeast has been an important center for pottery making since the 8th century



岡山城 (おかやまじょう) Okayama Castle

Okayama Castle, also known as “Ujo” or “Crow Castle,” was built in 1597 and is renowned for its unique black coloring and pentagonal base structure. While it was destroyed during World War II, it was rebuilt in 1966. The new structure includes enhancements such as an elevator system. Visitors to the castle can participate in activities such as Bizen pottery and looking out from a watchtower dating back to the 1620s.

☆富士芝桜祭り

The Fuji Shibazakura festival runs from April 11th through May 24th and features over 800,000 moss phlox plants, or *shibazakura*. The flowers are of various shades of pink, white, and purple, and can be seen growing vibrantly at the Fuji Motosuko Resort right near Mount Fuji. Visitors can enjoy Fuji-yoshida udon and soup while taking in the beautiful scenery!
