

1. How long have you been in Boston?

I've been in Boston since 2008. I came from Japan with my wife and a domestic short hair. I started my career in the US as a Ph.D. biochemist at a big pharma company, Novartis. I made the second big decision last year to take a new role at a small Japanese start-up and bridge the US and Japan.

2. What does your company do?

RevolKa is a venture-backed startup in Japan. We have a cutting-edge technology platform of artificial intelligence (AI)-



integrated protein engineering, called aiProtein. Our mission is to create unprecedented protein therapeutics and contribute to human well-being. Protein therapeutics are an increasingly important class of drugs especially for difficult-to-treat diseases, such as cancer. Naturally occurring or artificially designed proteins are used for the treatment. Our technology learned and mimics the biological evolution process and integrated AI to accelerate that at laboratories. We believe this will open the door to designing prominent molecules. We started our US office in Boston in Sep 2022 to expand our business outside of Japan. Currently, we are focusing on partnerships with pharma and biotech to co-create phenomenal therapeutic molecules by using our technology.




Sunday, May 21st, 2023 — 6:00 PM ET Online






