





This song went viral on social media and became an unprecedentedly huge hit.


When your hands are free, your mouth is open; when people lose their jobs, they can't make a living; when people have too much free time, they start talking nonsense

Fast facts!

-Okinawa is the southernmost and westernmost Japanese prefecture and is made up of over 150 islands

-Of the prefecture's 160 islands, 49 are inhabited and the largest and most populated is Okinawa Island, where the capital city Naha is -As Japan's only subtropical region, Okinawa is home to diverse ecosystems and is an ideal environment for many types of aquatic flora and fauna. 415 **coral species** live around the islands of Okinawa and provide a home to a wide variety of marine life

-Historically the center of the Ryukyu Kingdom, Okinawa has long been a key trading hub for trade due to its location

<u>波上宮 (なみのうえぐう) Naminoue Shrine</u>

The Naminoue, or "Above the Waves" Shrine, overlooks a beach from atop a limestone cliff in Naha, Okinawa. Originally a religious site for the indigenous Ryukyu Islands natives, the shrine became associated with Shintoism during the Meiji Era in 1890. Naminoue Shrine continues to be a famously sacred site in Okinawa, representing both Shinto and traditional Okinawan beliefs.

The Dragon Boat Race in Naha, Okinawa (*Naha Hari*) takes place early May during Golden Week. The Naha Hari is the largest of the Hari festivals in Okinawa. It is an island festival held by fishermen to pray for safe sailing conditions and promising catches and to show gratitude to the sea. The boats shaped and painted to look like dragons (sabani) are not just festive. They celebrate the historical voyages of Okinawans whose way of life was tied to the sea.




The Three-Thousandfold Universe
