



# PROGRAM & EVENTS


#### **OVERALL**

#### JSB MEETS JET ALUMNI

JSB Meets JET Alumni is a series of interviews with former JET participants from each prefecture about their experiences in Japan, a project made possible with the collaboration of the United States Japan Exchange & Teaching Programme Alumni Association (USJETAA). We work our way down the country and share interviews with participants from all 47 prefectures of Japan! 12 JET alumni stories in 12 prefectures were published in 2022, and JSB looks forward to publishing the last 11 prefecture stories in 2023.

#### **LETTERS FROM TOKYO**

Letters from Tokyo is our monthly correspondence with Tokyo-based author, journalist, and scholar Roland Kelts, who gives insight into the "real feeling" of being in Japan.
