Due to the remoteness of Rishiri Island, Miraku's "Yaki Shoyu Ramen" is often described as the hardest-to-get ramen in Japan. The Japan Society of Boston is co-presenting a screening of the Taiwanese-Japanese romance film "18×2 Beyond Youthful Days" followed by a talk with the director, Michihito Fujii.

In "18×2 Beyond Youthful Days," a lovelorn Taiwanese man embarks on a soul-searching odyssey across Japan, starring Kuang-Han Hsu (Greg Hsu) ("Marry My Dead Body," 2022) and Kaya Kiyohara ("In the Wake," 2021), this poignant and romantic journey captures the essence of youthful passion and longing, weaving a story that resonates deeply with the heart.

Born in 1986, director Michihito Fujii is a graduate of the Cinema Department at Nihon University's College of Art. Michihito made his directorial debut with OH! FATHER (2014), which is based on Kotaro Isaka's novel of the same name. His 2019 film, The Journalist, was nominated for six Japan Academy Prize categories, three of which it won, in addition to numerous other film awards.

We are pleased to present a special wagashi event as part of our celebrations of the 65th anniversary of the Kyoto-Boston Sister City partnership this year. Wagashi is a type of traditional Japanese confection that is often served with tea, and made from plant-based ingredients such as mochi, anko, and fruit. Wagashi are painstakingly crafted with an emphasis on aesthetics, and use cooking methods that pre-date Western influence in Japan.

We are honored to present a very special opportunity to observe a master wagashi maker right in Boston! Shoji Yamaguchi is coming from Kyoto, Japan to demonstrate

live wagashi methods and speak on topics such as the importance of seasonality in the art of wagashi making.

He is representing the famous wagashi store, **Suetomi**, which has been well known for their dedication to heartfelt, non-mass produced sweets in Japan for over 130 years. Participants will be able to ask him questions and will be served tea and samples of small wagashi made by Yamagushi-san. Please note that you will not be served the specific wagashi being made in the demonstration.



Iaido, the Way of the Sword, is the art of drawing and using the traditional Japanese sword. Iaido was practiced by the ancient Samurai for centuries. Did you know that actors on the 2024 hit period drama *Shogun* were instructed by masters from the Vancouver Iaido branch?

Boston Iaido is a martial arts school focused on Iaido. Established in 2003 and led by Cuong Nguyen-Sensei 7th Dan (Renshi), it is an official dojo of the World MJER Iaido Federation.

For our visit, Iaido masters will begin with a presentation to introduce the history and principles of Iaido and an explanation of their dojo and lineage, followed by a demonstration by members of the dojo. The majority of our visit will be a hands-on beginner Iaido workshop for any members who would like to try out Iaido for themselves.





It's exhilarating to see archers gallop on their horses down a narrow dirt track while aiming their arrows to split wooden panels in half. I cannot recommend it enough to others considering touring the prefecture. Don't sleep on Shimane!"

Japanese Tea Ceremony September 29th, 2024 at 2:00 PM EDT The Art Complex Museum

A ritual practice of preparing and drinking tea, the Japanese tea ceremony is a symbol of Japanese formality and spiritual aestheticism. The ritual is known in Japan as "chanoyu," which literally translates to "hot water for tea." Traditionally, it would be practiced in a specialized space called a tea house, designed specifically for tea ceremony gatherings.

The Art Complex Tea House, Sho-fu-an or "Wind in the Pines," was designed by Sano Gofu and built in Kyoto, Japan in 1969. It was reassembled at the museum in

1975 under the direction of Yasahiro Iguchi of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. It is a *sanjo daime* (3 and ½ mat) hut with two doors (one for service and one for tea) and a *daime tokonoma* or alcove.

The ceremony begins at 2:00 p.m. and admission is free. All are welcome on a first-come, first-served basis.

The MFA has one of the most comprehensive collections of Japanese art anywhere in the world. Reimagined galleries explore Japan's art and visual culture from the 7th century to today, including painting, sculpture, decorative arts, and selections from the Museum's vast collection of ukiyo-e prints. Evocative spaces include the renovated Japanese Buddhist Temple Room, which opened in 1909, and an adaptation of a traditional tea room, with tatami mats and an alcove. Multimedia displays illuminate performative art forms, such as Nō theater, bringing their drama to life.

The new space for the Museum's unparalleled Japanese collection—which was the first of its kind in America when established in 1890, and now holds about 100,000 objects—will change regularly, giving visitors the opportunity to see even more works in a setting that honors and celebrates Japan's rich history and cultural legacy.

Songs for Modern Japan: Popular Music and Graphic Design, 1900–1950 explores how sheet music covers provide a window into Japanese society and culture during

this period of immense transformation. Visitors discover how leading Japanese graphic designers of the day interpreted modernist international art movements like

Art Nouveau and Art Deco, and how demand for military sheet music with propagandist images grew in the 1920s and '30s, reflecting the country's imperialist aspirations. Through investigating styles of graphic design, bold typography, genres of music, and the societal environment in Japan, visitors get a glimpse of how design and music celebrating modernity and globalism gave way to endorsing nationalism.

About 100 sheet music covers from the collection of Mary and Robert Levenson—alongside paintings, photographs, textiles, music, film clips, and musical instruments from the period—capture the dynamic effects of international artistic exchange and the profound societal shifts in a globalizing Japan. The exhibition presents an opportunity to draw parallels between this pivotal time in Japan's history and today.

Born in Hawaii to parents of Okinawan ancestry, Toshiko Takaezu (1922–2011) was a technically masterful and innovative artist best known for her ceramic sculptures, which she treated as abstract paintings in the round. The MFA holds a significant collection of Takaezu's pottery—more than 20 examples are featured here alongside loans from private collections.

Challenging traditional presentations of American abstraction, "Toshiko Takaezu: Shaping Abstraction" celebrates the extraordinary range of Takaezu's work, aiming to make her contributions more widely known. It is organized in partnership with the Noguchi Museum and the Toshiko Takaezu Foundation.
