

John E. Thayer III Award 2025 Recipients



Christine Pilcavage Managing Director, MIT-Japan Program

Christine Pilcavage receives this award for her central role in program-building activities as Managing Director of the MIT-Japan Program in the MIT International Science and Technology Initiatives (MISTI), where she works closely with MIT students, faculty, and staff to share Japanese culture and foster strong ties between Japan and the MIT community.

Chris has been promoting cultural exchange and understanding between the US and Japan throughout her career. She has worked with USAID, various Japanese Ministries, local

governments, the Japan International Cooperation Agency, and the Japan Exchange and Teaching Program. For the last 10 years, Chris has served as the Managing Director of the MIT-Japan Program, where she connects MIT students to Japan through industry and academic internships. Chris was born and raised in Japan, and has also lived in Cambodia, the Philippines, Kenya, and the United States. However, she considers herself to be a true Kansai-jin.

A note from Chris: "I am honored to receive this year's Japan Society of Boston's Thayer Award joining a larger group of people who have dedicated their lives to strengthening the ties between the US and Japan. Looking back on my career spanning the fields of education, public health and international development I see an AKAI ITO—a 'red thread of fate'—sewing the tapestry of my passion in bridging the two countries that I love so much. Summer 2025 is the return of Japanese Prints at Highfield Hall & Gardens on Cape Cod. The College Women's Association of Japan (CWAJ)'s prestigious juried exhibit of contemporary printmaking will be on view from June 21, 2025 through October 26, 2025.

TRAILBLAZERS will feature 137 acclaimed Japanese printmakers, showcasing a range of printmaking techniques from traditional woodblock and intaglio to lithography, etching, aquatint, silkscreen, and contemporary digital innovations. The exhibition highlights five groundbreaking women artists whose contributions have shaped the evolution of contemporary Japanese printmaking: Toko Shinoda (1913-2021), Chizuko Yoshida (1924-2017), Reika Iwami (1927-2020), Noriko Yanagisawa (1940-), and Toeko Tatsuno (1950-2014).




Virtual Meet and Greet with the JSB Team Wednesday, October 29th, 2025 - 12:00PM EDT Online

Join us for a special collaborative Book & Film Club to celebrate the end of the year! We will be both reading and watching [The] Woman in the Dunes.

In this famous postwar Japanese novel, the first of Kōbō Abe's to be translated into English, Niki Jumpei, an amateur entomologist in pursuit of a rare specimen of beetle, wanders into a strange seaside village, whose residents all live in sandpits. He is taken prisoner, and, along with a widow cast out by the community, he is forced to move into her sandpit and continually shovel away the sand that threatens to take over the village. In Niki's struggles to escape his prison and his developing relationship with the woman, he gradually comes to understand the existential nature of life. (From WorldCat's description)

The film is a Japanese New Wave avant-garde arthouse psychological thriller film. Directed by Hiroshi Teshigahara, it received widespread critical acclaim and was nominated for two Academy Awards.

Floating Clouds... The Cinema of Naruse Mikio On now through November 3rd, 2025 Harvard Film Archive

Lesser known to US audiences than Japanese contemporaries Ozu and Mizoguchi, with whom he is often compared, Naruse Mikio (1905-1969) was an equally prolific, subtle and consummate, yet increasingly restrained stylist whose eighty-nine films—of which sixty-nine survive— spanned from the silent era through the 1960s. Although Naruse worked skillfully across genres in the 1930s, during the post-WW2 period he began to almost exclusively direct work in the broad categories of the "women's film" and "shomin-geki," films focused on the daily dramas of contemporary lower-middle-class life, with a frequent emphasis upon directly challenging gender inequality.

Co-presented by The Japan Foundation, the Harvard Film Archive joins venues across the continent in paying tribute to one of Japan's overlooked masters. The HFA's series will be the most extensive of the North American retrospectives, featuring forty-five film prints (all but one on 35mm) from the Japan Foundation and National Film Archive of Japan.
