How long have you been coming to Boston to perform?

I first came to Boston as an 18 year old freshman Violin and Psychology major at Boston University. I moved all the way cross country from Southern California for school. It was a huge shock to my system, especially experiencing winter for the first time! But I loved Boston so much, I stayed at BU after undergrad and completed my master's degree in opera. [...]

I was originally engaged to sing Suzuki in Madama Butterfly in Fall 2020 at Boston Lyric Opera. As we all know, the world shut down, and performance organizations shuttered their doors. BLO decided to reschedule the production for Fall 2021. In the spring of 2021, after the horrific shooting of Asian women in Atlanta and the increased violence against Asians in the U.S., BLO announced that they could not, in good conscience, present the production of Butterfly they had planned on.

We then embarked on a year-long journey we called "The Butterfly Process." We hosted 7 conversations via zoom that centered Madama Butterfly. We talked about the problematic



aspects of the production, as well as why it's important to keep the piece in the operatic canon. It was through the Butterfly Process that I started working closely with and eventually became an Artistic Advisor at the company.

Currently, I come to Boston 3-4 times a year for in person meetings, trainings, and performances. I also do a lot of "advising" via zoom and email. I'm proud to be part of a company that does such meaningful work in

the operatic industry.

We will discuss the opportunities and challenges of a Japanese apprenticeship, a process that results in a unique insight in the importance of tradition in handcraft and the responsibilities of craftsmen in the context of culture and society.

Traditionally made with ground chicken you can substitute ground beef, pork, or tofu. This is very easy to make and the slightly sweetened meat makes it a favorite with kids. We round the meal out with a simple miso soup. And for a special treat we celebrate the fall fruit, apples, by learning how to make an apple bunny – essential fare for every kid's bento box.




Between the Lines Thursday, September 7th, 2023 - 6:00 PM ET Online





Boston Lyric Opera presents Madama Butterfly September 14 & 22 - 7pm, September 17 & 24 - 3pm Emerson Colonial Theatre 106 Boylston Street, Boston MA 02116

In a brand-new production from Boston Lyric Opera, wander through the nightlife of San Francisco on the eve of Pearl Harbor through the story of Butterfly, a nightclub performer contributing to the war effort, and Pinkerton, a young soldier, on the eve of his deployment. A culmination of BLO's three-year exploration of authentic storytelling through <u>The</u> <u>Butterfly Process</u>, this production examines the experience of Japanese Americans during a critical moment in U.S. history. The creative team and cast is full of talented artistic Asian Americans previously underrepresented in the operatic world.
